





### Principal's Report on 1997/98



Mr and Mrs Chong, Ladies and Gentlemen, Teachers, Students and Graduates of Q.E.S.,

It is our great honour to have Mr and Mrs Chong Hok-shan officiate at our Speech Day ceremony this afternoon. I wish to extend my personal welcome to all guests who are present today in spite of your many engagements.

First of all, I feel obliged to introduce to you Mr Chong. He is a member of the Q.E.S. 1967 Form Association. He graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree from McGill University in 1971 and obtained an MBA degree from Columbia University in 1973. Currently, Mr Chong is the Chairman of Chung Nam Watch Co. Ltd., which is one of the largest and most diversified watch manufacturers in Hong Kong with manufacturing plants as well as affiliated companies in Hong Kong, Switzerland, France, Canada and various other countries in Asia, and a workforce of more than 5,000 employees. He is also the Vice-President of the Hong Kong Chiu Chow Chamber of Commerce, former Chairman and present Advisor of the

Federation of Hong Kong Watch Trade and Industries and member of the Hong Kong Trade Development Council's Watch and Clock Advisory Committee. It is an honour to the school to have a prominent old student to be our special guest today and I am sure his presence will go a long way towards encouraging and motivating our present students.

I would like to begin my report with our public examination results. 89 Secondary 7 students took the Hong Kong Advanced Level Examination in 1998, and 70 of them were offered places by the local and overseas universities. The admission rate was 78.7%. Of these candidates, Chan Hiu-fong and Lau Chi-hin each got 4 A's; Chan See-yan and Choi Wing-hung also passed the examination with flying colours, each obtaining 3 A 's.

In the 1998 Hong Kong Certificate of Education Examination, we also achieved very impressive results. 149 Secondary 5 students sat for the examination and 148 of them attained grade E or above in at least 5 subjects, representing 99.3%. A number of our students had outstanding performance in the examination: one got 10 A's; one got 7A's; three got 6 A's; and six got 5 A's.

In the Junior Secondary Education Allocation (JSEA), out of 162 Secondary 3 students, 156 were promoted to Secondary 4 in the school.

As regards scholarships and awards, I am pleased to say that three of our S5 students were awarded the Li Po Chun Scholarship to study for a two-year matriculation course. Cheung Hoi-ying (S5D) is now studying in the United World College of the Atlantic in Wales, England; Yum Chun-wa (S5D), in the Li Po

Chun College in Shatin; Yiu Yip-hing (S5B), in Mahindra College, Bombay, India.

Cheung Hoi-ying, a girl in S5D was selected in May as one of the Outstanding Students for the year 1997/98 in the Yau Tsim Mong District. In June she also won the 97/98 Hong Kong Outstanding Students Award from the Lion & Globe Educational Fund.

Law Ka-ho (S5D) won the Rensselaer Medal Award from the Rensselaer Polytechnic of the United States in May for his excellent performance in Mathematics and Sciences. By virtue of his outstanding results in the 1998 Hong Kong Certificate of Education Examination, he was also awarded Government Scholarship for a two-year Hong Kong Advanced Level Examination Course commencing in September 1998.

Another student who performed exceedingly well in the 1998 Hong Kong Certificate of Education Examination was Yu Wai-shing (S5A). He ranked first in History among all candidates territory-wide and was awarded the Supremetech Engineering Scholarship as a result.

Ladies and gentlemen, I think you would be equally delighted to hear about our performance in some inter-school competitions. Three of our S5 students took part in the 12th Statistical Project Competition for Secondary School Students organised by the Hong Kong Statistical Society in February 1998 and won the championship in the Junior Section.

Eleven of our students were given the opportunity to demonstrate their talent in three mathematics contests. To begin with, in the 16th Hong Kong Mathematics Olympiad conducted in March 1998 by the Hong Kong Institute of Education and the Education Department, two S3 and four S4 students each won a Certificate of Merit. In addition, Leung Wing-chung (S6C) won a Gold Award in both the Asian Pacific Mathematics Olympiad 98 and the International Mathematical Olympiad Hong Kong Preliminary Selection Contest. In the same Selection Contest, Yuen Pak-ho (S4D) came off with a Silver Award, while Law Ka-ho (S5D) and Yuen Pak-kei (S4D) each got a Bronze Award.

In December 1997, Lo Si-yuet (S3D) got the First Honour in the 80th Girl Guides Anniversary Challenges.

To improve students' English and Chinese proficiency, we have constantly encouraged them to take part in language-related activities and their results have always been commendable. In the 49th Hong Kong Schools Speech Festival, one student emerged as the champion in English verse-speaking and a choral speaking group came off as the first runner-up. In the same Festival, four students also got the championship in Chinese verse-speaking.

Another language-enhancement measure that we have taken was the extensive reading schemes. Ten students were nominated for the Shun Hing Reading Award Scheme run by the Education Department and Ho Yat-fan, a student in S4D, was awarded the second prize in the Chinese Book Report Competition of the Senior Section.

In addition, three of our students were awarded prizes in connection with their participation in the Inter-school Book Report Competition of the 1998 EPSON Foundation Reading Awards in May, which was part of our implementation of the Hong Kong Extensive Reading Scheme. Two students, Ho Chun (S2E) and Wong Lai-kwan (S1C), both won a High Commendation Award in the English Book Report Competition in the Junior Section.

In a Library Project Competition entitled "The Future Development of Science and Technology in Hong Kong" and organised by the Education Department in March this year, three S5 students and five S4

students together won a Merit Prize.

Turning to music, I am pleased to say that the performance of our students in various musical events in the 50th Hong Kong Schools Music Festival was impressive with three students winning the championship.

Three girls -- Wong Hiu-kwan (S1C), Au Wing-ying (S2D) and Yeung Sui-lai (S3B) -- each won the championship in an anti-graft activity among schools in the Yau Tsim Mong District conducted by the Independent Commission Against Corruption in November and December 1997.

In the inter-school sports competitions conducted by the Hong Kong Schools Sports Federation in November 1997, our boys won the championship in the Inter-school Handball Competition. In the Inter-school Badminton Competition for Girls (Grade C, Division 2) in December 1997, we were also the champion. In early 1998, Yuen Chui-ying (S3C) was awarded the championship in Girls C Grade Long Jump, and Lee Chan-pong (S2B) came first in Boys C Grade Discus.

Ladies and gentlemen, many of you may have heard of our School Camp, which was set up by the Parents-Teachers Association in September 1962. In February this year we celebrated the 35th anniversary of the School Camp with a tree-planting ceremony and other activities, which were attended by students, both past and present, parents, and teachers as well as representatives from the PTA and OSA.

The school underwent massive renovation during the summer holiday, notably with the replacement of computers in the Computer Room and the installation of a public address system, a loop system, a cassette recorder and a screen in each classroom to enhance students' learning. The students' changing rooms have also been extensively refurbished, and the football field re-turfed.

Incidentally, our school has been given approval by the Education Department to continue using English as the medium of instruction in the years ahead.

Having briefly reviewed our achievements in various aspects of school life, we wish to avail ourselves of this opportunity to express our cordial thanks to the Parents-Teachers' Association under the leadership of Mr Kwan Sek-yiu, and to the Old Students' Association under the chairmanship of Mr Tong Wai-lop, for their constant support. At this point, we would like to pay tribute to Mr Tong for his generous donation of half a million dollars for the development of Information Technology in the school.

Mrs Sin Chow Dick-yee, Principal of the school in the school year 1997-98, has been transferred to the Development Section of the Advisory Inspectorate Division. We thank her for her devoted service to the school and wish her every success in her new endeavour.

Our students' achievements remind me of the dedication and hard work of all my staff, to whom I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude. In particular, I wish to thank Mr Chow Kam-cheung and Mrs Wong Lai Po-ching, Assistant Principals, for their assistance in school administration and management.

Finally, let me thank once again Mr and Mrs Chong, our guests of honour, parents, and teachers and principals from other schools for your presence today.

I wish you all, ladies and gentlemen, good health and a very bright future to our school leavers. Thank you very much.

### Speech delivered by

### Mr CHONG Hok-shan

### Guest of Honour at the Annual Speech Day



Mr. Yeung, Honourable Guests, Teachers and fellow schoolmates.

It is a great honour for me to be the speaker of the ceremony today.

Looking back, when I graduated from QES in 1967, Hong Kong, like today, was in the midst of a crisis. There were large scale social unrest, demonstrations, riots and bombs were everywhere. At that time, the future of Hong Kong looked highly uncertain and the Hong Kong economic outlook was indeed very gloomy.

This year, Hong Kong also faces a crisis of a different kind. We have been bombarded by an Asian economic meltdown, stock market crash and real estate slump. And, indeed, many Hong Kong people are really worried about our future.

Today, let us try to analyse the present situation and see how we should prepare ourselves to face the future.

The present work economic situation is under the general influence of 3 main forces:

The frist force is economic contraction. In the past 20 years, the world has come through a continuous expansion phase and is now entering into a stage of global consolidation and contraction. The present economic crisis in Hong Kong and Asia is not an isolated case but is the beginning of a major world correction. In the past 20 years, production capacity as well as efficiency have multiplied enormously which have lead to oversupply and overcapacity in all industries, including the service industry. The conventional wisdom that cheaper products and services will induce more consumption does not hold any more, as consumption in many cases is reaching saturation point especially in developed and developing countries. And, inevitably, the work must adjust and consolidation is the only solution.

The second big force is the appearance of the so-called global economy. As the world has become a more homogeneous place together with technological advances in information technology and data management, we see large scale multi-national mergers and acquisitions. Every day we can read in the newspaper, even multi-billion dollar companies find it necessary to merge or join forces one way or the other. All these mergers and acquisitions would mean bigger pressure on the smaller companies and at the end, there may only be a few giant comparies dominating in each industry.

Thirdly, we are also entering into the world of the technology explosion. Technological advances not only promote changes in efficiency or productivity, but will also radically strike out a lot of traditional

thinking and traditional ways of doing things. For example, in the U.S., there is speculation that very soon all building and shopping centres will have their own energy production and energy saving system, which means companies like Hong Kong Electric Co., Ltd. and China Light & Power, which are China well-established traditional industries may became obsolete overnight.

In fact, all these forces do not act alone but are interrelated and interact with each other and the result is even more frightening. It means in the next one or two decades, a lot of jobs will be consolidated and lost. A lot of companies will either have to change or disappear. It also means that companies' operations will not be bound in one place only. For example, companies can have their headquarters in Hong Kong, their Design Department in Shanghai, their Accounting Department in Australia and so on and so forth. This implies the graduates of Hong Kong have to compete not just between themselves but with graduates of China, other Asian countries and in fact with graduates from the whole world.

So, how can Hong Kong students prepare themselves in such an economic environment? It is clear that academic achievement alone is not enough as there are millions and millions of graduates coming out from different countries, who are very hard-working. They are well-trained and may ask for less remuneration than Hong Kong students. Future businesses need students who are broadly-trained and who can adopt to any situation, make rational judgements, can communicate, know when to lead and when to listen. Above all, they must show initiative and demonstrate good organisational skills. These are the qualities that Hong Kong students must possess in order to stand out from the others.


Hong Kong students are, in fact, in a perfect environment to build up these qualities. You are lucky to live in one of the most international cities in the world. International in the sense that we have first hand and direct exposure to different cultures and news, as well as information of all kinds. This gives you a great advantage over students from other countries. But, one must know how to make use of this changing knowledge by opening one's eyes and ears to absorb, analyse and digest it. I am sure all of you know all the latest video games, but have you ever spent some time in admiring and studying the new games' latest 3D graphics, as well as marvelling at the software's and ingenious innovations?

QES students have an added advantage. It has always been our culture to place strong emphasis on extra-curricular activities. Our school is also one of the few schools which has our own school camp. But, mere participation is not enough, you have to take an active role to organise, co-ordinate and review such activities. Do make full use of these activities to learn to build up your social skills, learn how to adapt in different situations and learn to think with initiative. And, keep in mind, no matter how trivial this knowledge may seem at this time, it is relevant and will make a lot of difference some time in your future endeavours.

After 1967, despite the crisis, Hong Kong has made tremendous progress socially and economically to become a world renowned international city. I am confident that Hong Kong, today, will overcome the economic downturn and come out stronger and better than before. And, I am sure our fellow schoolmates can make full use of all the resources offered to them to excel and play an important role in this fast changing world.

Finally, I wish you all a very happy and fruitful future.

A Christmas Carol

by Charles Dickens

Ebenezer Scrooge, an unkind, mean, lonely old man is awakened by three ghosts - the Ghost of Christmas Past, the Ghost of Christmas Present and the Ghost of the Future, who show him Christmas in the past, the present and the future. This changes his self-centred outlook, and he becomes the most generous old man in London and the man who knows how to enjoy real happiness, better than any other.


pray to God every day, in a quest for peace on earth. Unfortunately, there are a number of wars every year. Does this mean that our requests for peace are unreasonable?



'English has become less important in Hong Kong after the handover.' Do you agree?



People always say, 'Hong Kong is no longer a British colony, so English has become less important than before.' Do you agree? I don't think so.

In early March this year, the government issued a list which stated that amongst all the secondary schools in Hong Kong, only 114 had been granted permission to use English as a medium of instruction. Many schools and parents were opposed to this policy and appealed to the Education Department. Surveys

reveal that over 80% of parents intend to send their children to one of these EMI schools, as they think that English is a universal language.

Statistics also reveal that an increasing number of parents want to send their beloved children to native English speaking countries, such as the U.S.A. and Britain, to further their studies and receive better education.

The Hong Kong government is investing money into employing native English teachers to teach in secondary schools in order to develop the standard of English of local students. This indirectly tells us that the government emphasizes the teaching of English, even if it is a foreign language.



'Self-learning should be promoted in Hong Kong schools.' Discuss.



According to research recently undertaken by the Curriculum Development Committee (CDC), Hong Kong students have the best performance in multiple-choice question type tests amongst the Asian cities. On the other hand, they have the worst performance in doing open-ended questions, which have no definite answers and require students to express their own ideas. These results show that there is something wrong with the existing education system in Hong Kong.

It is a common perception that students in Hong Kong are under much greater pressure than those in other countries. The examination-oriented

courses give students the misconception that examinations are more important than knowledge. Students are trained to accept facts, memorize information and listen to what the teachers say. As a result they lack creativity, the ability to think independently and to develop a critical mind. They are simply trained to study for their examinations.

Recently, people from different walks of society have realized the seriousness of the problem, and have suggested various changes to the education system. The Hong Kong Examinations Authority (HKEA) has suggested that in the future, public examination results should include the students' performance in their school work. Some people have suggested that selection of entrants to university should no longer be based solely on academic performance. Some have even suggested that the whole examination system be abolished.

No doubt, the current examination system and also the academic system place too much emphasis on examination results and fail to stimulate students to think. All the suggestions made by different people have one thing in common - they all support the belief that students' self-learning ability should be enhanced. 'Self-learning' means that students should be trained to explore new knowledge on their own without the guidance of teachers or supervisors.

Self-learning can help Hong Kong students in many ways. For one thing, they no longer have to rely on textbooks, which may not be up-to-date, as their only source of knowledge. As we know, in this age of information, things are changing every minute. In order to obtain the most up-to-date knowledge, we must widen our scope of view and explore new inventions on our own. This may be achieved through other reference books, the mass media and other sources such as the Internet. By doing so, students can not only enrich themselves, but at the same time develop a critical mind, so that in their studies, they will not merely listen to what the teachers say, but will also think independently and judge the validity of what they have been told. By choosing to learn about what they are interested in, students can also develop all-round and unique skills.

It has also been observed that many Hong Kong students are not very interested in their studies. One reason is probably that they find the current curriculum a very clumsy and boring one which does not offer them much opportunity to think and criticize. The promotion of self-learning can probably solve this problem, for students can then learn at their own pace and level. When they have established an interest in their studies, they will surely learn more efficiently and happily.

To conclude, therefore, self-learning should be promoted in Hong Kong schools so as to train students to be critical thinkers and so that they can contribute to the future well-being of our society.

#### 'Self-learning should be promoted in Hong Kong schools.' Discuss.

There were the days when school was the only source of knowledge. Nowadays, this idea is not valid anymore. Hong Kong students have long been criticized for their low language level. One reason for this is their lack of ability to think independently and access their own information. Should self-learning be promoted, students will benefit greatly as self-learning is the pre-requisite of success.

Self-learning is a feasible method of altering the ubiquitous problem of low language level. Hong Kong students are regarded as being passive in learning, and relying too much on the teachers. Most students are not prepared to get information from anywhere else but in schools. As a result, effective learning is obstructed. In view of this, self-learning should be promoted to allow students to display more initiative. If this is done, students will become more active in learning and their knowledge level can be raised.

If students insist on obtaining knowledge only in school, then they have a misconception regarding learning. With the rapid progress of modern society, information becomes outdated frequently. To avoid being placed on the scrap heap by society, we must retain our competitive power. This is based on up-to-date knowledge and skills. The most up-to-date information is often not found in textbooks and notes. Knowledge can be updated through self-learning. By means of the Internet and other technology, more up-to-date information can be obtained. Reports indicate that the competitive power of Hong Kong workers is



lower than that of those in other Asian countries. Only with improved technological skills can this problem be alleviated. Therefore, self-learning should be promoted to regain the competitive power of Hong Kong workers, since it advocates the study of advanced information technology which hasn't yet been advanced by other Asian countries.

The Hong Kong education system has long been criticized for its examination-oriented nature. Education seems to serve the purpose of training for examinations. This is not a healthy phenomenon. Examinations should not be the only consideration, nor the only objective of education. The soaring importance of public exam results aggravates the situation. Indubitably, examinations are of paramount importance in school life, yet, we should never overlook other educational criteria. Extra-curricular knowledge obtained from self-learning may be useful in developing some particular interests and hobbies, ranging from astronomy to psychology, which cannot be studied in school. If it were not for our interests, we would not be spontaneous in learning. If self-learning is promoted, students will have more incentive to learn, not only about the subjects studied in school, but to also broaden their knowledge base.

Some people say that self-learning is time-wasting and meaningless. Without a teacher, learning will become ineffective due to the students' inability to search for appropriate materials. However even though students may face difficulties in self-learning, it is a valuable opportunity to help them to learn the skills of independent thinking - skills which are badly needed by Hong Kong students. Added to this, problem solving skills and other methods of learning can be acquired through self-learning. Although it may be a long process, it is worth undertaking. Only with the application of self-learning can success in education be maximized. Those who think self-learning is not important, if not meaningless are simply ignoring it's advantages.

In order not to be left behind, it is high time Hong Kong schools promoted self-learning. Self-learning is the road to success and the most effective way of acquiring knowledge. Given the advantages of self-learning, why hesitate to take action?

#### A day alone


